OCCTE Update—Nora Kohlenberg ANFR:

- Perkins Documents: I want to thank all of the teachers who have submitted their PIPs, Application for Program Approval and course syllabi. There was a lot of paperwork this year and I want to thank you for your time and dedication to complete the documents needed!
- Perkins Data: There is one more Perkins requirement that each program needs to complete yet this school year and that is entering your Perkins data for your students. The deadline for data entry is May 31, 2011. We know that several schools had a lot of snow days this year, so if your school is not able to meet the May 31st deadline, please contact Nora Kohlenberg, 605-773-474, nora.kohlenberg@state.sd.us, or Brad Bies, 605-773-4726, brad.bies@state.sd.us.
- Teacher Academies: Standards in Practice™ (SIP™) Workshop will be offered at both the Swan Lake and Camp Bob Marshall retreats. This is not to be confused with the Standards Implementation Workshop where teachers learned how to implement the standards in their classrooms. The Standards in Practice workshop will take the standards that teachers are now implementing and focus more on the lessons and assignments that are offered in the class. SIP will incorporate Blooms Taxonomy and help a teacher create projects and assignments that add more rigor and relevance through high-level learning. Change in student achievement happens in the interaction between teacher and student about assignments, defined as challenges to demonstrate learning. The higher the challenge, the greater the learning, given appropriate context. A schedule and workshop syllabus will be emailed to teachers.
- CTE 101, June 2, 2011, Mitchell: This workshop will explore Career and Technical Education initiatives as well as approved program requirements. The workshop will provide attendants with documentation and explanation of each document that is used by the Office of Career and Technical Education. This is a great workshop for new teachers and even if you are not a new teacher and want to brush up on all the Perkins requirements to understand why we have just gone through all the paperwork this winter and spring, this would be a good workshop for you as well. As you know, SDSU experienced serious budget cuts recently, many impacting the College of Agriculture & Biological Sciences. Agricultural Education as a major is quite "safe" and stable. However, due to budget

issues and timing of his retirement, Dr.

Moeller's position will not be filled immediately. We are hopeful that within a year or so, it will be, as additional faculty ill be needed to grow the program from its current status. In the meantime, SDSU graduate, Ellen Thompson will be assisting with various courses, student teaching supervision, and program-related activities. Currently, there are approximately 70 students in the major, with a sizeable class of freshmen expected to join us in the fall.

One summer course will be offered by SDSU faculty this summer, targeted at secondary Ag Ed & FACS Ed teachers interested in serving as cooperating teachers (SEED 699-Supervision of Student Teachers). Though not mandatory, the course will be a great investment of time for new and experienced cooperating teachers, alike. It will address expectations for cooperating teachers, the roles of cooperating teacher in mentoring, supervising and evaluating, and various other topics. Upon completion of the course, teachers will be better prepared to serve as cooperating teachers – and be more comfortable with the process for observing, evaluating and critiquing student teacher progress. The course will be offered in a hybrid format - involving a few days on campus in June, some online work, and a final face-to-face meeting at SDACTE in Pierre.
